Prayer for the Perseverance of Vocations

O God, You have constituted Your only-begotten Son supreme and eternal Priest for the glory of Your majesty and the salvation of mankind: grant that those whom He has chosen ministers and dispensers of His mysteries may be found faithful in fulfilling the ministry they have received.

Benediction (4:00 pm)

Toward the end of the exposition, the priest goes to the altar, genuflects, and kneels. All sing:

Tantum Ergo

Veneremur cernui:
Et antiquum documentum
Novo cedat ritui:
Praestet fides supplementum
Sensuum defectui.

Genitori, Genitoque
Laus et jubilatio,
Salus, honor, virtus quoque

The priest continues with the following or other similar prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, You have given us this sacrament in remembrance of Your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of Your body and blood help us to experience the salvation You have won for us and the peace of the kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever.

All respond: Amen.

The priest continues with Incensation of the Blessed Sacrament and Blessing of the faithful.

The people join the priest in praying ***The Divine Praises***:

Blessed be God.

Blessed be His holy name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man.

Blessed be the Name of Jesus.

Blessed be His most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be His most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy.

Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in His angels and in His saints.

The priest repositions the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle, and all sing:
